have?

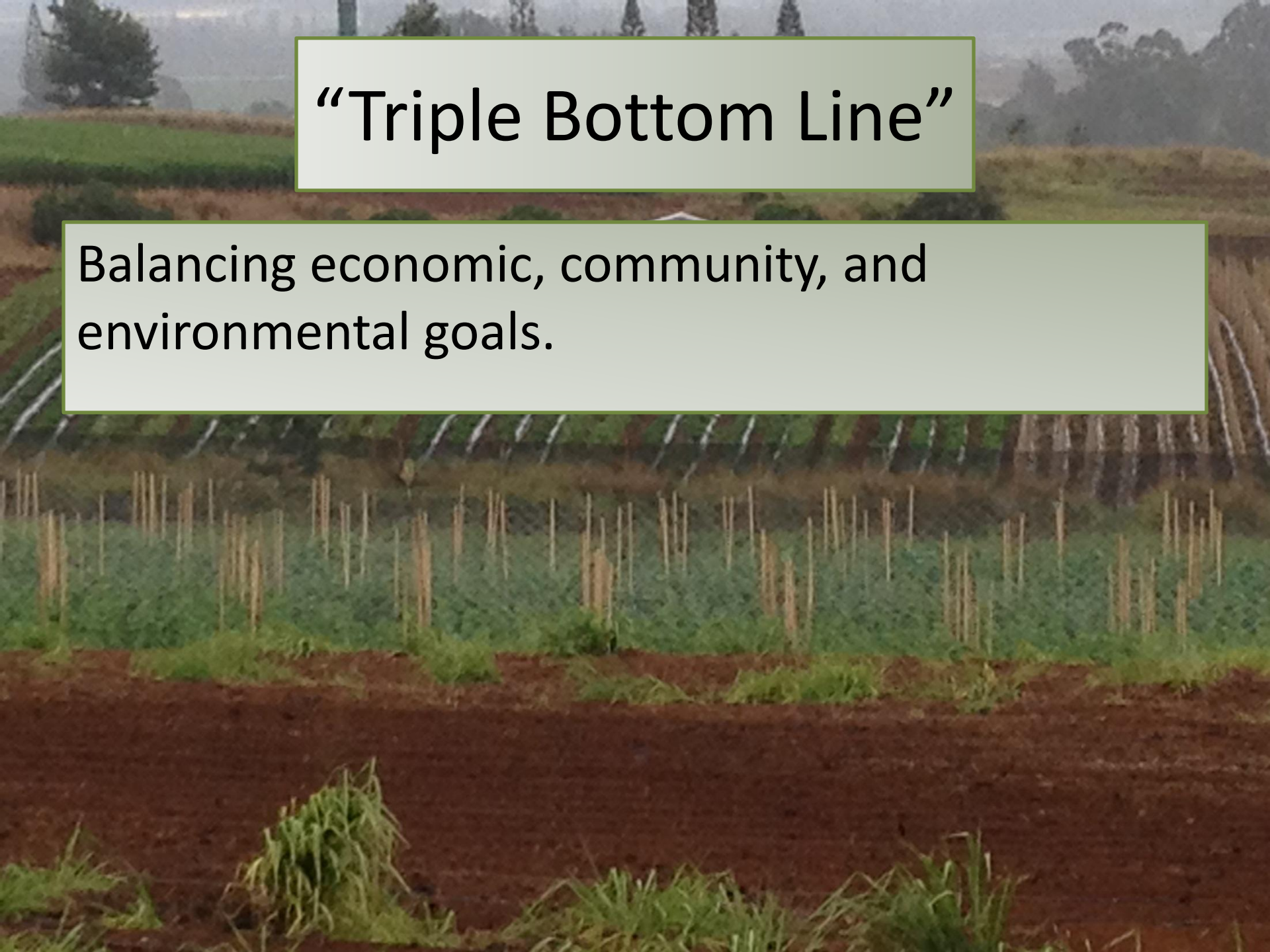
