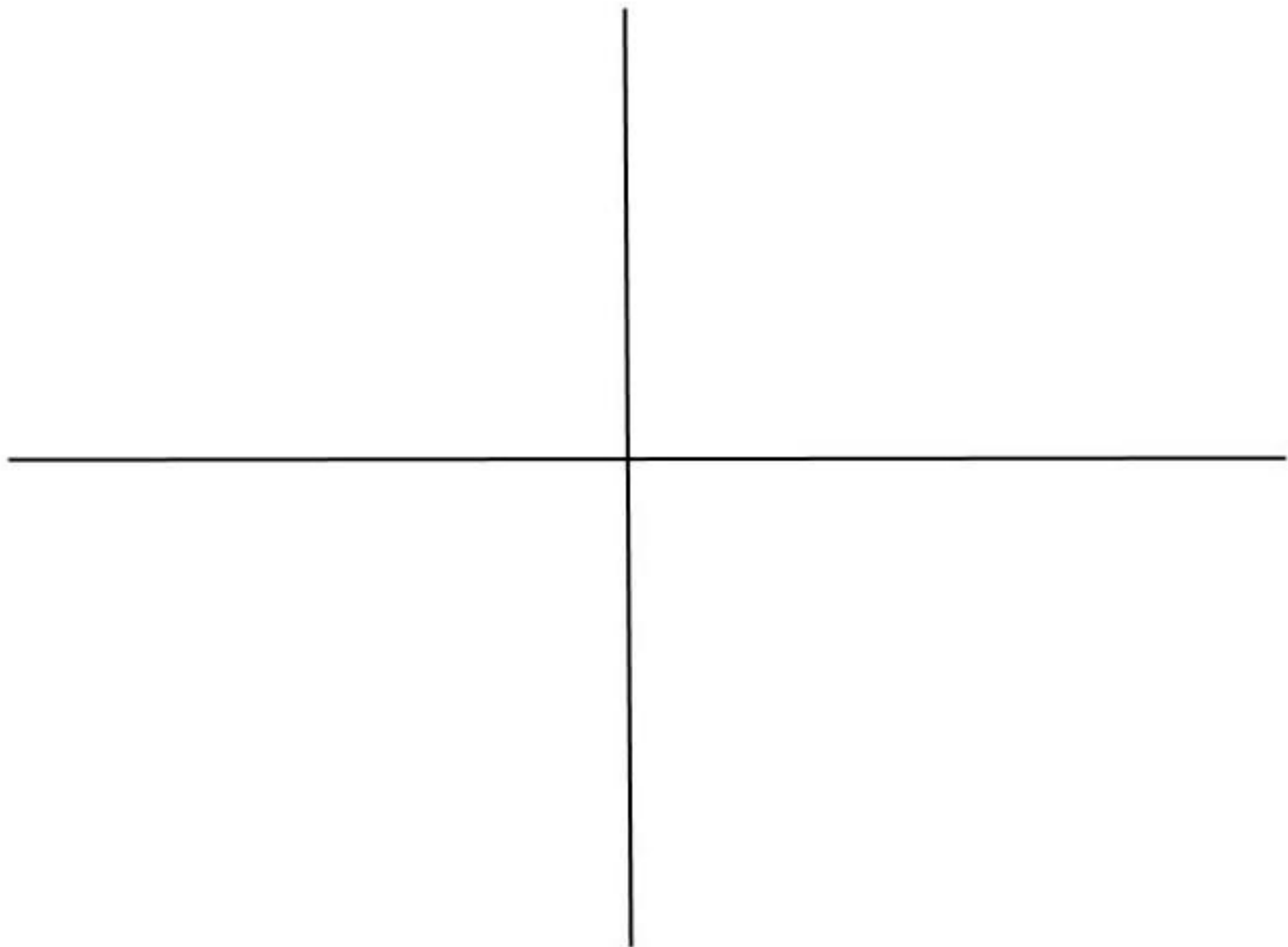


How can tourism support conservation ?
