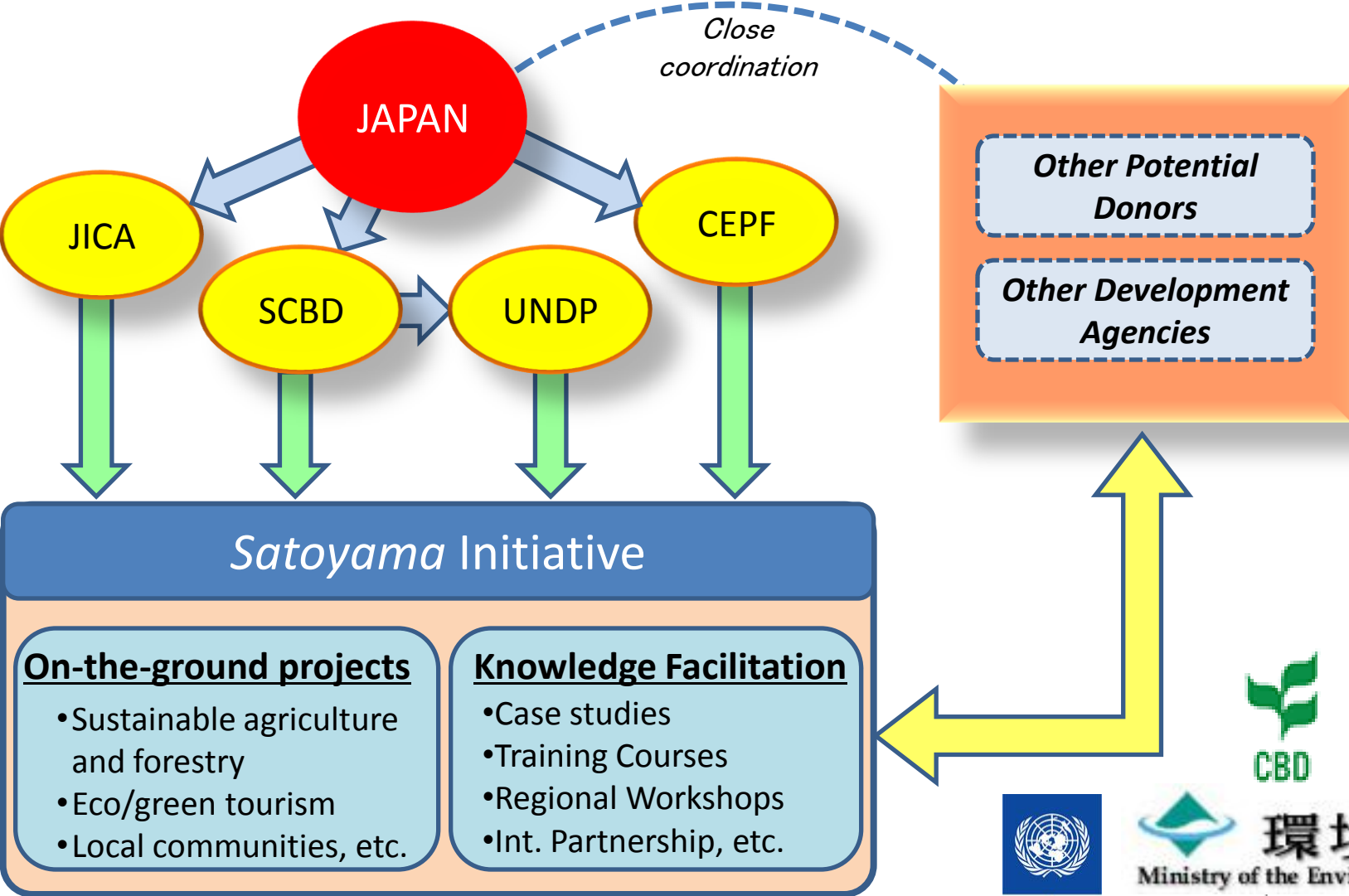

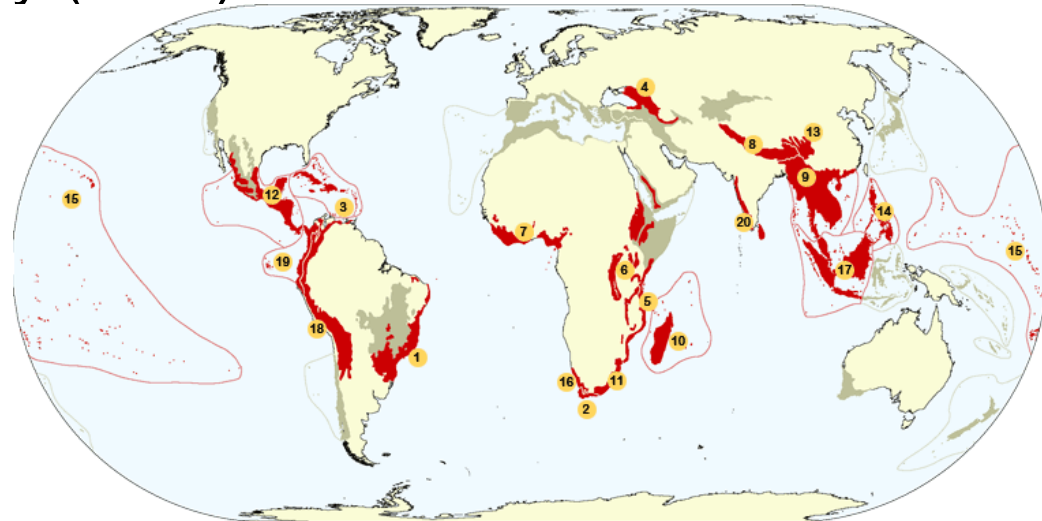

CEPF Grants

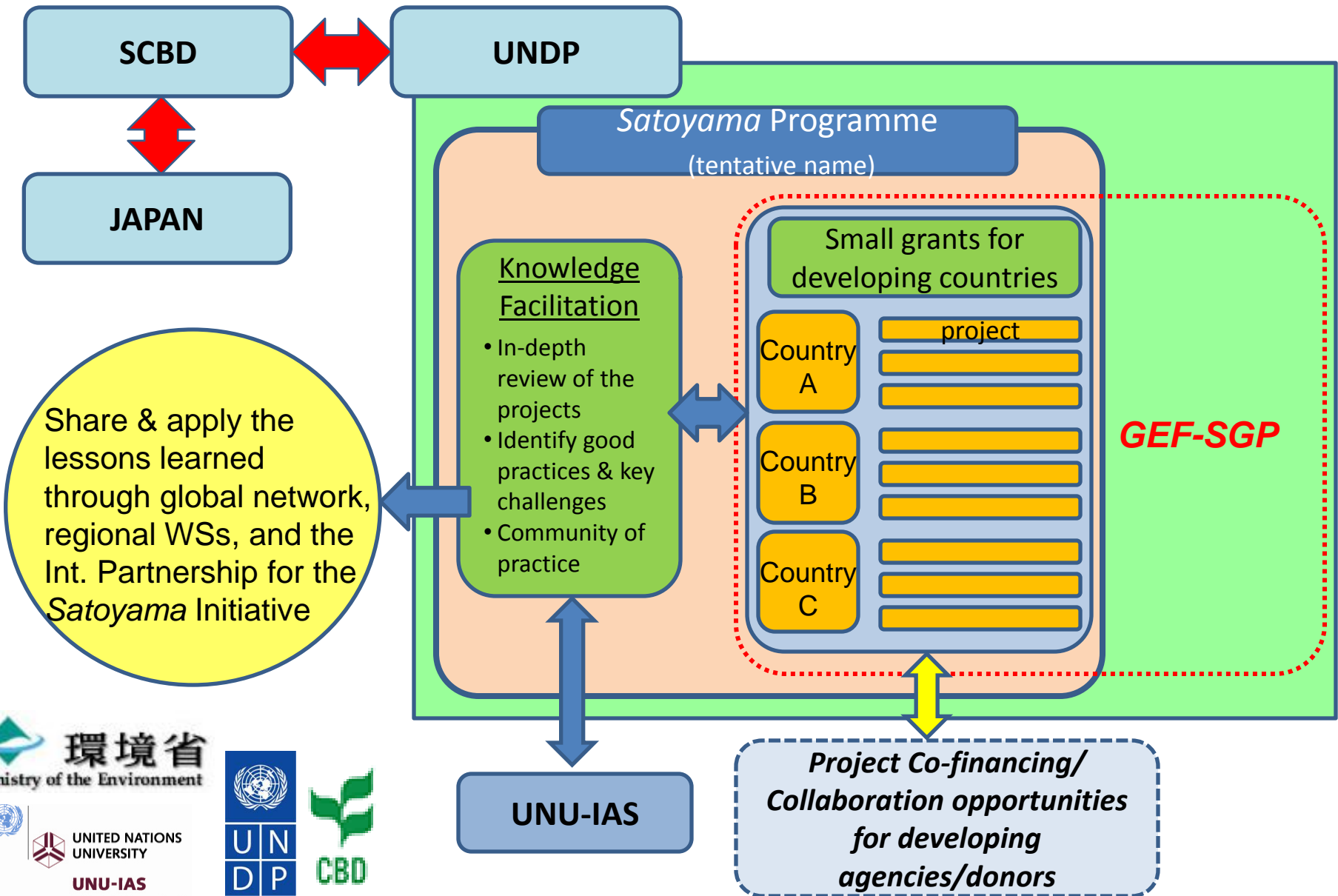
- Target biodiversity hotspots in developing countries
 - Go directly to civil society groups
 - Contribute to economic well-being and social stability
 - Achieve results that are tangible, replicable and scalable
- 18 investment strategies implemented (51 countries)
 - \$120 million in grants awarded; \$261 million leveraged by civil society groups receiving those grants
 - Nearly 1,600 civil society groups supported
