Satoyama and Satoumi



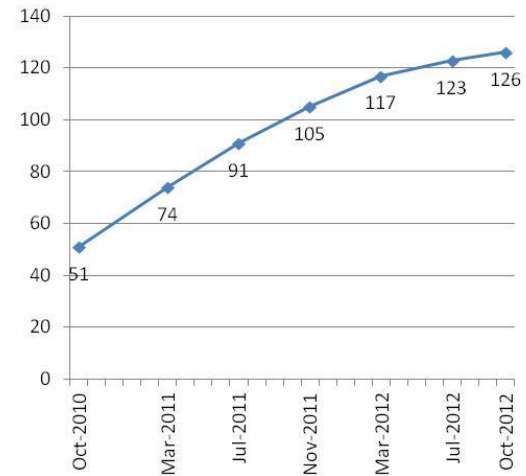
“Satoyama and satoumi landscapes”

Socio-Ecological Production Landscapes (SEPLS) around the world

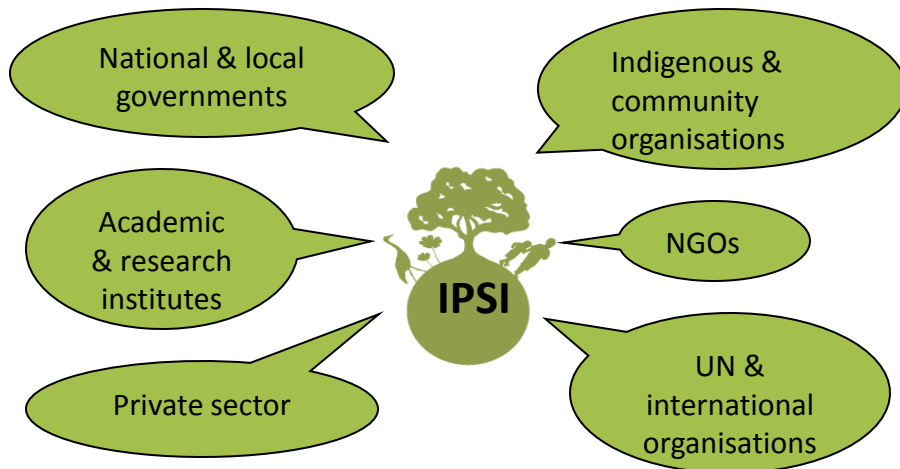


Landscapes formed through long-term interaction
between humans and nature

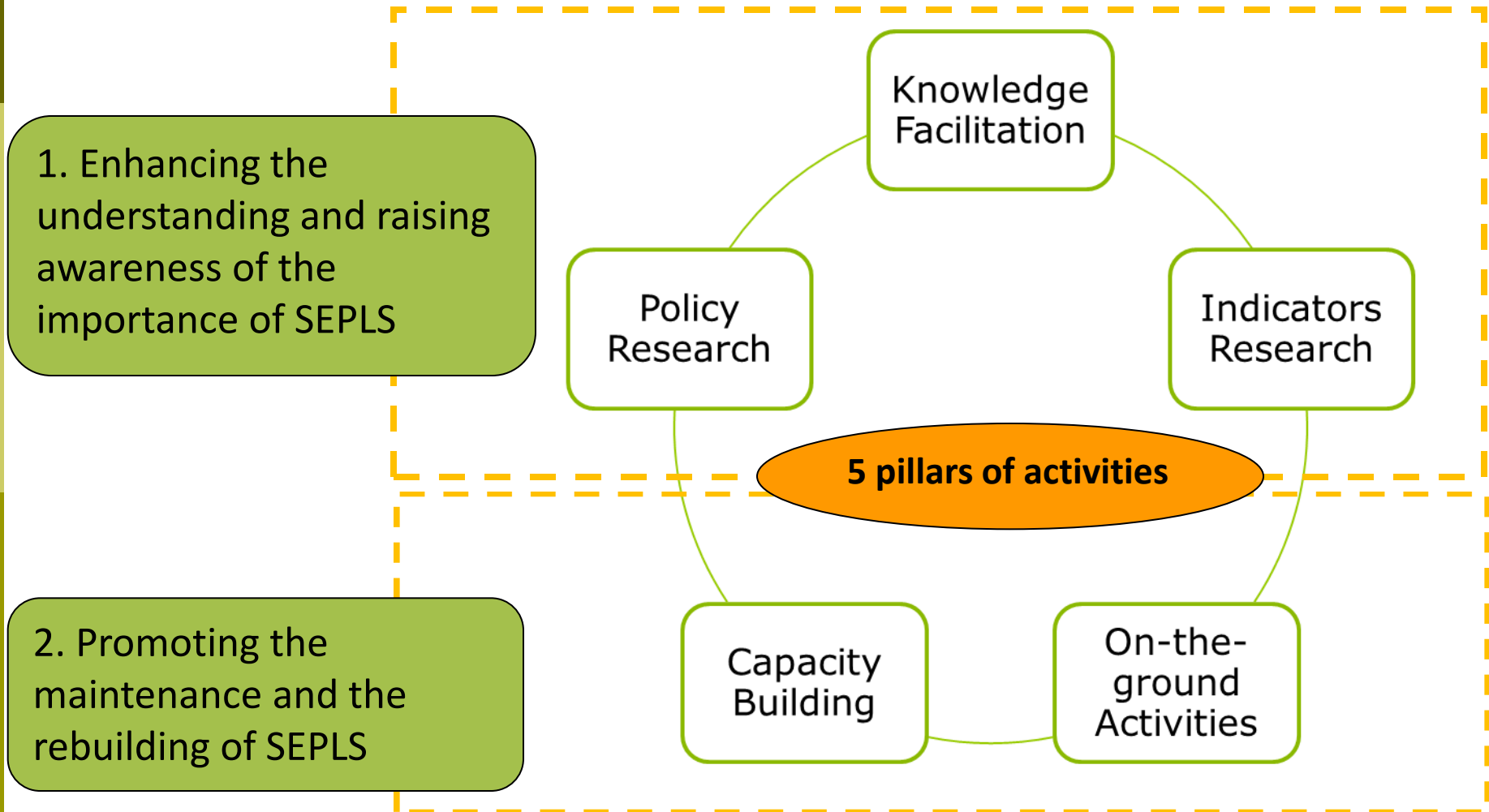

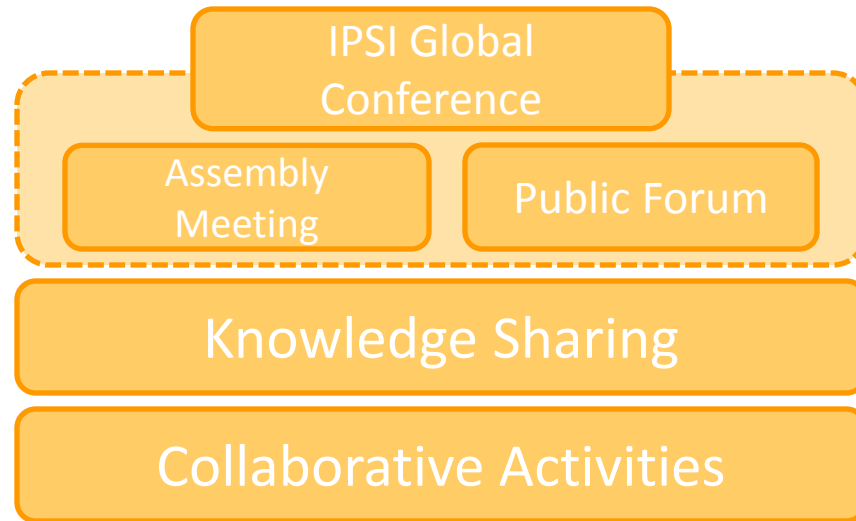
