### Outline

"*Satoyama*" is a Japanese word referring to socio-ecological production landscapes and seascapes (SEPLS), which are mosaics of diverse land uses and ecosystems shaped through sustainable human interactions with nature over a long period of time. The International Partnership for the *Satoyama* Initiative (IPSI) was established during CBD COP10 in 2010 to protect and revitalize SEPLS.

"*Satoyama*" concept is useful for strengthening the management of protected areas by improving the livelihoods of communities in buffer zones. Such approaches can be applied in international aid activities, which play significant roles particularly in sites in developing countries.

This side event aims to illustrate the usefulness of the *Satoyama* concept for effective landscape ecosystem conservation by highlighting both theory and practices.
