Illegal mining activities upstream polluted three main waterbodies from the forest and degraded forest lands

There has been a national ban on illegal mining which has improved the water quality. Again, steps are being taken through a National Afforestation Program to restore these degraded lands.

Illegal hunting and poaching of species such as white-bellied pangolin and degradation of habitat of species through illegal mining

5 Community Resource Management Areas (CREMAs) have been formed in communities to support and check illegal poaching and other unsustainable environmental practices. CREMA's are managed by member of local communities around the Atewa Forest Reserve.

Message to the CBD for post-2020
