Consolidation and Replication of
Effective Landscape Approaches for
Biodiversity Conservation and Human Livelihoods















This side event will focus on **consolidation of best practices and lessons learned** from almost a decade of landscape approaches under the International Partnership for the Satoyama Initiative (IPSI), and the potential to replicate, upscale, and extend these up to and into the post-2020 CBD agenda.

Three unique funding mechanisms for landscape and seascape approaches have been implemented over the past decade – the Satoyama Development Mechanism (SDM); the Community Development and Knowledge Management for the Satoyama Initiative programme (COMDEKS); and the "GEF-Satoyama Project" – and each has been undertaking the process of consolidating achievements and compiling lessons for the future.

Experts from each of these projects and others will present their findings and analysis, including discussion of the relationship between different landscape approaches such as "other effective areabased conservation measures", as mentioned in Aichi Target 11.
