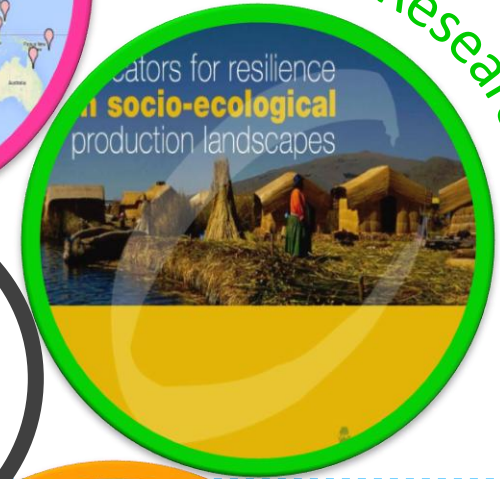

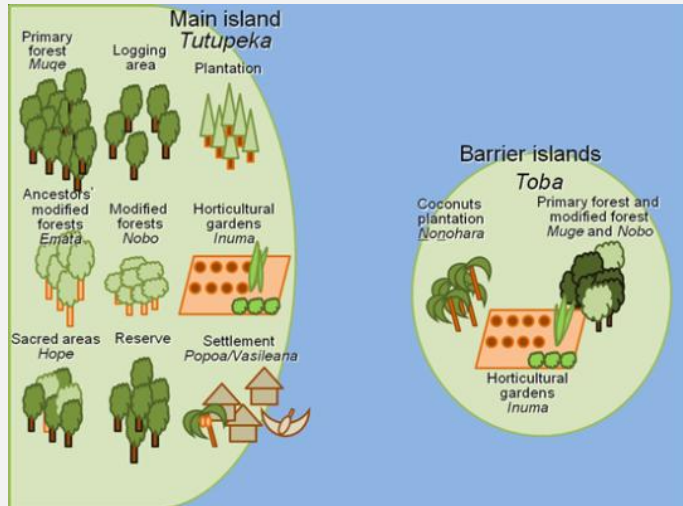

Example Case Study: Western Province, Solomon Islands



1. *Agricultural fields on the main island are managed by a shifting cultivation system.*

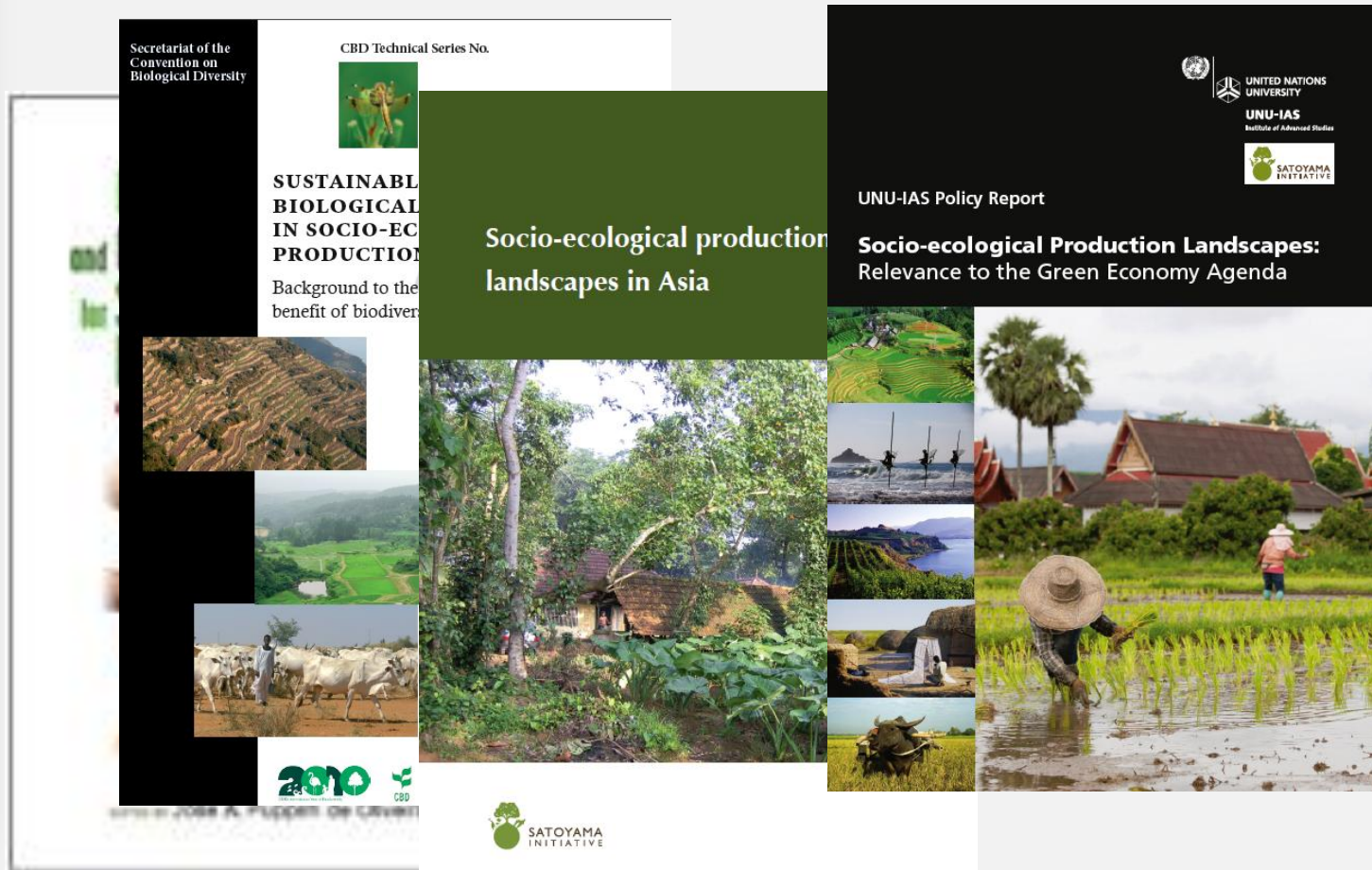
2. *On Toba island, farmlands are managed in a different way based on the soil fertility.*

3. *Timber for canoe-making can be harvested using customary rules*

Recognition of the value and importance of local knowledge helps local communities manage their land in a sustainable manner

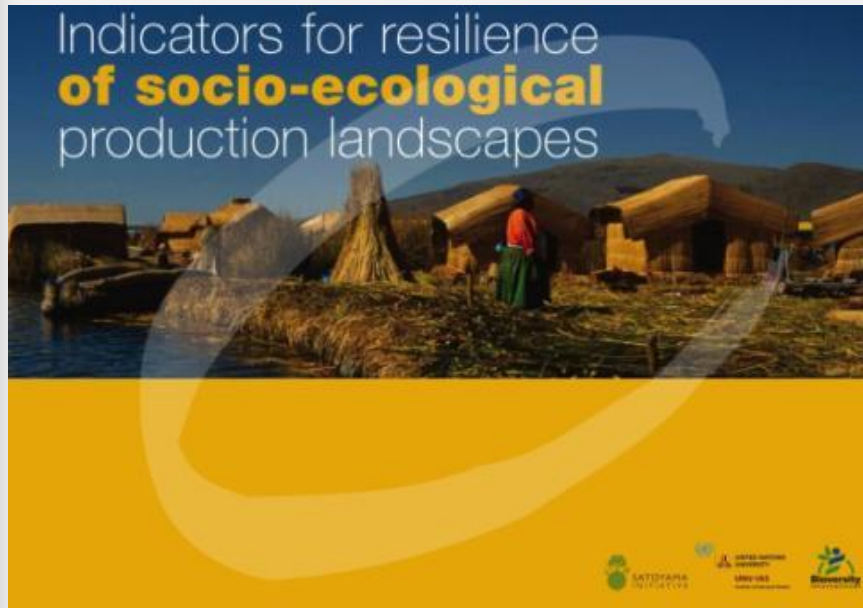

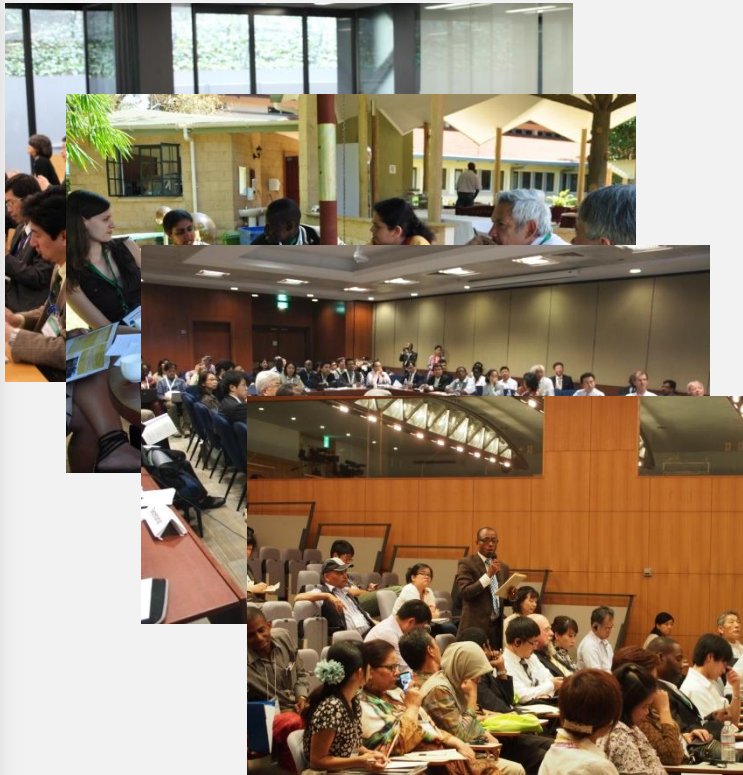


- Measuring a community's capacity to adapt to change while maintaining biodiversity
